Work underway to build major heritage center at Millstone

MILLSTONE — A committee chaired by 4-H historian Jim Clark has made significant progress in the effort to construct a permanent 4-H museum at Millstone 4-H Center.

At the latest meeting a tentative, draft mission statement was endorsed by the commit-

tee, dedicating the museum to, among other things, "inspire the spirit of 4-H in youth."

The museum will celebrate and reflect upon 100 years of the

4-H experience in North Carolina in the context of 4-H's dynamic role in the American Century.
