In 2009, North Carolina 4-H celebrated 100 years of providing the youth of our state the life skills they need to reach their full potential by working and learning in partnership with 22,980 caring volunteers and youth development professionals. It is through those relationships that young people become confident, mature adults ready for success in today's challenging world. The year-long celebration, themed "We Are 4-H!" gives North Carolina 4-H the opportunity to remember its past and break-through to the second century of innovative 4-H programming as it shifts to meet the changing interests of today's generation and the needs of our changing state.

North Carolina 4-H took root as corn and tomato clubs in Ahoskie, North Carolina in 1909, and soon evolved into the state-wide 4-H program we know today. With over 239,000 youth actively involved last year, North Carolina 4-H is as relevant today as it was 100 years ago. From rocketry to workforce preparation and nutrition demonstrations to a week-long camping experience at one of five residential facilities, North Carolina 4-H is a community of young people who are learning leadership, citizenship and life skills that will enhance their lives and prepare them to be assets to their communities and to our state. Wherever youth are today, 4-H is there.

The past year has been filled with greatness for North Carolina 4-H! Under the leadership of State 4-H Leader Dr. Marshall Stewart, participation in statewide events and camps continues to grow. In 2009, we celebrated the Centennial of 4-H in North Carolina. The 4-H family started the celebration with the premier performance of our Centennial Song, *We Are 4-H: Tomorrow's Song* at our 2008 4-H Lifetime Achievement Awards Gala. We had a major Homecoming during 4-H Congress for 4-H'ers, alumni and friends. We will continue to celebrate 100 years of 4-H through 2010.

Continued support from the General Assembly resulted in an additional \$4 million to support our 4-H camps and education centers, bringing the total to \$11.5 million over the past two years. Our gifts have culminated in 375 endowments and enhancement funds that support 4-H. I am proud to have created a new 4-H scholarship this year and challenge you to consider how you can best support our 4-H'ers. These funds provide ongoing support for local 4-H programs, college scholarships for outstanding 4-H'ers and many more innovative state 4-H programs supporting 241,000 youth and 21,000 volunteers across North Carolina.

As we celebrate this milestone for 4-H, join me in thanking everyone who has contributed to the North Carolina 4-H Development Fund and encourage continued support to kickoff the second century of 4-H youth development programs across our state.

NATIONAL 4-H HALL OF FAME

2007 National 4-H Hall of Fame Inductee: Fred Wagoner

In October 2007, Fred Wagoner was inducted into the National 4-H Hall of Fame as a result of his lifelong involvement with 4-H. Mr. Wagoner's involvement began in the 1930s as a Guilford County member, and in 1940 he joined the North Carolina 4-H Honor Club. His favorite 4-H projects focused on wildlife, and he attended wildlife camps for several years. His camping experience would serve him well as he would ultimately become the Director of Millstone 4-H Camp and the 4-H State Camping Specialist.

A graduate of NC State University, Mr. Wagoner began his professional 4-H career as the Edgecombe County 4-H Club Agent in 1949. As the county 4-H agent, he would go to Millstone for wildlife camp with some of his 4-H'ers. Of Millstone, Mr. Wagoner said, "I had been to Millstone as a 4-H'er back when it was first built, and it was just the place for me." He became the state 4-H Camping Specialist in 1963 after serving as state 4-H leader for the Southeastern and Eastern districts. He oversaw the integration of the state's five 4-H camps, working closely with the NC A&T State University camping specialist.

Because of his love of camping and 4-H, Mr. Wagoner and his wife Dot, who live in Raleigh and Laurel Springs, created the Fred and Dot Wagoner 4-H Camp Renovation and Repair Endowment to ensure a strong 4-H camping program for future generations of 4-H'ers. They also support the 4-H Forestry Cumulative Record Award and the forestry trip to National 4-H Congress.

2008 National 4-H Hall of Fame Inductee: M. Edmund Aycock

From the age of 10 M. Edmund Aycock, a Wayne County native, was involved with 4-H. His lifelong love and support of 4-H at the local, state and national level led to his induction to the National 4-H Hall of Fame in October 2008, five months before his death at the age of 95 in March 2009. Mr. Aycock began work as an extension agent after graduating from NC State University in 1936. For 13 years he served as a 4-H and farm agent in Vance, Johnston and Lenoir counties. Mr. Aycock would ultimately have a successful banking career with Wachovia and serve on the Board of Commissioners for Wake County for many years, even as chairman.

Mr. Aycock received many awards over his lifetime, including the prestigious Watauga Medal from NC State University in 1984. The Watauga Medal honors people who have made significant contributions to the advancement of the university. Despite his many other interests and accomplishments, Mr. Aycock's interest in 4-H remained strong throughout his life, and he was an honorary lifetime member of the NC 4-H Development Fund Board of Directors. One reason could be that he met his wife, Elizabeth, over 70 years ago at what is now known as 4-H Congress. Together Mr. and Mrs. Aycock created the Edmund and Elizabeth Aycock 4-H Scholarship Endowment in 2002 to provide scholarships to 4-H'ers across the state.

North Carolina 4-H Museum and History Center

In 2007, a committee of passionate 4-H supporters was formed with the mission to develop a museum and history center highlighting the past, present and future of 4-H. Recent gifts from 4-H partners are propelling the museum from a vision to a reality. Among these gifts are:

- \$100,000 from the North Carolina Peanut Growers Association to name the Front Hall of the House That 4-H Peanuts Built,
- \$75,000 from the North Carolina Farm Bureau Federation to name the Old-Fashioned Farm Shop; and
- \$15,000 from Pee Dee Electric Membership Corporation to name the Front Porch of the House That 4-H Peanuts Built.

The centerpiece of the museum is the House that Peanuts Built. The house was donated to the NC 4-H Development Fund by the Rudolph Carl Ellis family and moved from Fayetteville to Camp Millstone in 2004. Mr. Ellis built the house with proceeds from selling Ellis' Fancy Peanuts from Dunn to Elizabethtown. His inspiration was the result of farming a plot of peanuts as a 4-H project during the Great Depression and roasting them in his mother's kitchen. The gift of \$100,000 from

the North Carolina Peanut Growers is especially helpful and will ensure that a large room of the storied House That 4-H Peanuts Built is dedicated to the Ellis 4-H story, peanut production past and present, and the nutritional value of peanuts as witnessed through the many peanut foods presentations and record books made by 4-H'ers for generations.

The Pee Dee Electric Membership Corporation's gift will name the front porch of the House that Peanuts Built and will ensure that the story of 4-H's role in rural electrification is told to new generations.

The house is just one of the leaves of the clover. The other leaves are a proposed history center, a heritage courtyard and the Farm Bureau Old-Fashioned Farm Shop where "people will be able to work with vintage farm equipment and tend old-fashioned farm plots placed around the museum and history center" according to committee member Carolyn Register.

The committee has a \$4.5 million goal and meets monthly in Raleigh. Retired NC State University English professor and 4-H Honor Club member Dr. Jim Clark chairs the committee. ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

2007-2008 Scholarship Summary:

Fifty-seven scholarships were awarded to 47 North Carolina senior 4-H'ers totaling \$51,000 in support for the 2007-2008 academic year. The scholarships had an average value of \$895 and were utilized at 20 different colleges and universities, including community colleges, private colleges and universities and institutions within the 16-campus UNC system, with the majority attending NC State University. Of the 22 4-H'ers attending NC State University, two outstanding 4-H'ers received the Park Scholarship. The Park Scholarship is a four-year all inclusive scholarship covering everything from tuition and fees to personal expenses.

2008-2009 Scholarship Summary:

For the 2008-2009 academic year, 59 scholarships were awarded to 42 North Carolina 4-H'ers. The awards were given to students across the

state from Alleghany to New Hanover counties. The 4-H'ers attended 17 different institutions, including the US Naval Academy. Eighteen of the 42 recipients attended NC State University.

Edward Gore/General Hugh Shelton 4-H Leadership Scholarship

The Edward Gore/General Hugh Shelton 4-H Leadership Scholarship Endowment was established in 2005 by the Edward Gore Family of Sunset Beach, NC. While the family had not directly been involved in 4-H, they recognized the tremendous impact the program has in developing outstanding young people. Because of the Gores' love for, and commitment to, furthering the education of deserving students in Brunswick County and throughout North Carolina, they chose to offer a renewable scholarship to an outstanding 4-Her attending Mr. Gore's alma mater, Campbell University, or NC State University. The values-based leadership exemplified by Edgecombe County 4-H alumnus General Henry Hugh Shelton (Ret.)'s efforts with the endowment and programs bearing his name echoed the same values that helped to make the Gore's successful business leaders in Brunswick County. In tribute to these value-based leadership programs, they chose to honor General Shelton's vision by sharing the name of this scholarship awarded to an outstanding North Carolina 4-H'er. Pitt County 4-H'er Milo Lewis was named the 2009 recipient of the Edward Gore/General Hugh Shelton 4-H

Leadership Scholarship. Milo will utilize this \$2,000 renewable scholarship while attending NC State University.

Harrill Scholarship 2007:

Recognizing the most outstanding 4-H'ers in North Carolina, the L.R. Harrill Scholarship recipients embody the first NC 4-H State Leader's idea of "grand champion" young people. Through Mr. and Mrs. Harrill's vision of rewarding outstanding 4-H'ers wishing to obtain higher education, and continued support from the Harrill Family Foundation, these scholarships are currently valued at \$1,100 per year for four years of study. Through endowment funds, these scholarships will continue to recognize the Harrill legacy to NC 4-H for many years to come.

Horse Scholarship 2007:

After many years of providing annual support for academic scholarships, The North Carolina 4-H Horse Advisory Board established the North Carolina 4-H Horse Scholarship Endowment in 2006. The board created the endowment to support outstanding 4-H Horse Program members by awarding a minimum of two college scholarships annually. Scholarships, valued at \$1,000 each, are awarded to deserving 4-H members who have participated in the NC 4-H Horse Program to further their education at any institution of higher learning.

The North Carolina 4-H Development Fund quietly turned 50 on June 25, 2009! The Development Fund was created to raise private support for North Carolina 4-H programs and its initial goal was to raise one million dollars! This goal was met in 1969 with over 89 counties achieving their campaign goal.

Today, the North Carolina 4-H Development Fund has close to \$6 million in assets and is in the midst of the "Campaign for the Clover," a fundraising initiative with a goal of \$11.5 million over five years to launch a second century of 4-H! The campaign includes raising funds for all aspects of the North Carolina 4-H Youth Development Program:

- NC 4-H Museum and History Center—\$4,500,000
- NC 4-H Programs for the Future—\$3,000,000
- NC 4-H Livestock endowment—\$2,000,000
- Volunteer and Agent Support—\$1,000,000
- NC 4-H Marketing and Recruitment—\$1,000,000

This campaign will help fund contemporary 4-H programs at county, regional and state levels by focusing on the above initiatives, the largest being the NC 4-H Museum and History Center. The Museum and History Center will tell the story of NC 4-H and provides naming opportunities for corporations, foundations and individuals (see page five for more information). Programs for the Future will support nine curriculum areas in 4-H emphasizing leadership, citizenship and life skills while the Livestock Endowment will build upon an existing endowment to ensure livestock continues to be an integral part of the 4-H experience. An exciting part of the campaign is the Volunteer and Agent Support initiative which will provide opportunities for agent and volunteer professional development training to better serve the growing number of 4-H youth across the state. The final piece to the campaign is marketing and recruitment, a vital component to sustain the 4-H program and reconnect alumni, friends and

supporters to the program using a variety of mediums such as social networking and blogs.

Larry Wooten, president of NC Farm Bureau, and former US Congressman and NC Community Colleges president, Martin Lancaster, chair the volunteer leadership of the campaign. LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Each year, the 4-H Lifetime Achievement Awards honor and celebrate individuals and families who play a significant role in the success of North Carolina 4-H. In addition to being a celebration, the event raises private funds to help continue the many 4-H programs in which over 241,000 North Carolina youth participate.

In 2008, the Lifetime Achievement Awards celebrated the “Spirit of the Arts” in downtown Raleigh at the Progress Energy Center for the Performing Arts. Lynda Loveland, who co-hosts Bill and Lynda in the Morning on WRAL Mix 101.5 and is a 4-H alumna, hosted the event which honored Hilda Pinnix-Ragland, Northern Region Vice President for Progress Energy Carolinas, and John Hood, President and Chairman of the John Locke Foundation, with North Carolina Lifetime Achievement Awards. Fred H. Wagoner, Extension 4-H Camping Specialist Emeritus, was also celebrated as a 2007 National 4-H Laureate, which he became upon his induction to the National 4-H Hall of Fame.

The contributions of Tommy L. Burleson, an Avery County 4-H'er and member of the 1974 NC State University NCAA championship basketball team, were recognized, as were those of the Edith Stuyvesant Dresser and George Washington Vanderbilt II family. Edith Vanderbilt bolstered 4-H in many ways. She hosted camps at Biltmore Estate and, most importantly, supported L.R. Harrill, the state's first 4-H leader. The W.L. and Sylvia Teeter family, co-founders of the Harris-Teeter grocery store chain, were also recognized. The Teeters boast four generations of 4-H'ers. The 2009 Lifetime Achievement Awards were held in Concord at the Embassy Suites Hotel. The event highlighted 100 years of 4-H.

During each event, the Syngenta 4-H Showcase of Excellence featured exhibits by current 4-H'ers. Energy efficiency, water conservation, healthy food choices, GIS mapping, photography, first aid and 4-H's statewide partnership with Operation Military Kids were among the 2008 exhibits. In 2009, exhibits highlighted healthy lifestyles, technology, 4-H history and animal agriculture.

The Dee-Dee and Cam Harris Talent Showcase brought current and former 4-H'ers to the stage both years. The song, We Are 4-H! (Tomorrow's Song), premiered during the 2008 ceremony, and in 2009 the 4-H Performing Arts Troup debuted scenes from We Are 4-H—the musical.

The support of our many sponsors led to the events raising \$221,359 in 2008 and \$182,815 in 2009!

Many thanks to everyone who contributed to the success of these events. Proceeds support a myriad of 4-H programs each year.

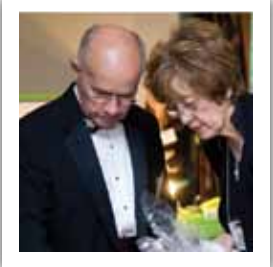

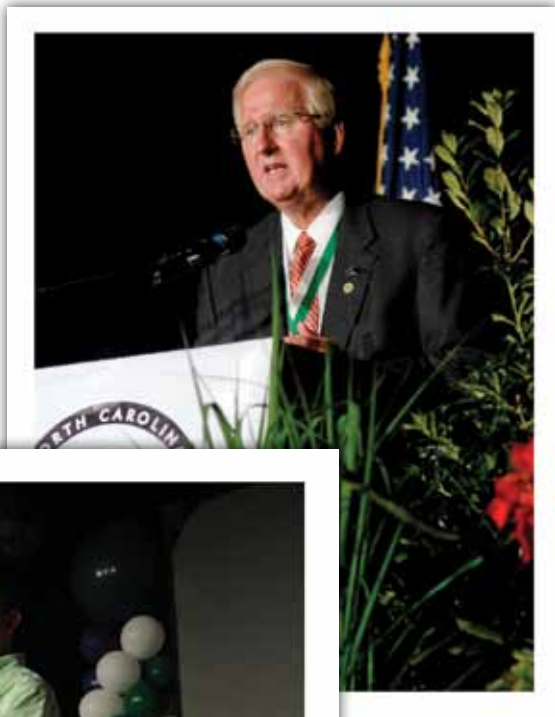

Outright Gifts

Gifts of Cash, Check and Credit Card

Cash gifts may be made by writing a check payable to the North Carolina 4-H Development Fund or to the specific named fund within the 4-H Development Fund. You may also make a gift at our secure on-line giving site (<https://ceres.cals.ncsu.edu/advancement/>). Using appreciated securities (stocks and bonds) is a popular method of making a gift to 4-H. You may be able to transfer stock or mutual fund holdings to 4-H while securing significant tax benefits for yourself and your family. Gifts-in-Kind

Gifts of property such as equipment, paintings or other art objects may be donated to 4-H and entitle you to an, Income tax deduction. Because items of this nature are subject to estate tax, a donation, either during your lifetime or as a bequest under your will, may also produce estate tax savings. Gifts of Real Estate

A gift of real estate may, Include a gift of a principal or vacation residence, farm, timberland, commercial buildings or unimproved land and may be for the entire property or a fractional interest. Appreciated real property is also an excellent asset to use to establish a charitable remainder trust.

Gifts of IRA Funds or Life Insurance

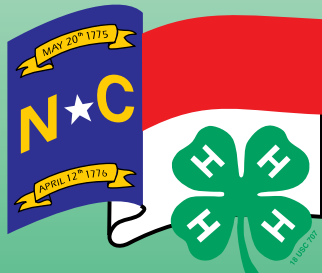
